## SHOEMAKER'S DANCE

## **LS E-5**

Formation: Double circle, partners facing, boys with backs to center.

## **SONG**

Meas. (2 counts per meas.; i.e., 1 = 2 counts)

1 Wind, wind, wind the bobbin: (The count is 1, and, 2, and.)

2 Wind, wind, wind the bobbin;

3 Pull, pull;

4 Tap, tap, tap;

**5-8** Repeat Meas. 1-4

9-16 Tra, la, la, and away we go,

Tra, la, la, and away we go,

See my new shoes neatly done,

Away we go to have some fun.

## **DANCE**

- 1 With arms elbow-high and hands clenched, roll one arm over the other three times. This represents "winding the thread."
- 2 Reverse the roll and "wind" in the opposite direction.
- **3** Pull hands apart and jerk elbows backward twice, "pulling and tightening the thread."
- 4 Tap own fists together three times, "driving the pegs."
- **5-8** Repeat Meas. 1-4.

**9-16** All face LOD and join inside hands with partner. Skip around the circle. At end of final phrase of music, stop and face partner, ready to start the dance again

*Note*: A long time ago shoes were not made by machines in factories but by shoemakers in their little shops. The shoemaker sewed the leather with a big needle and a very heavy thread. He fastened the soles on with pegs or nails.
